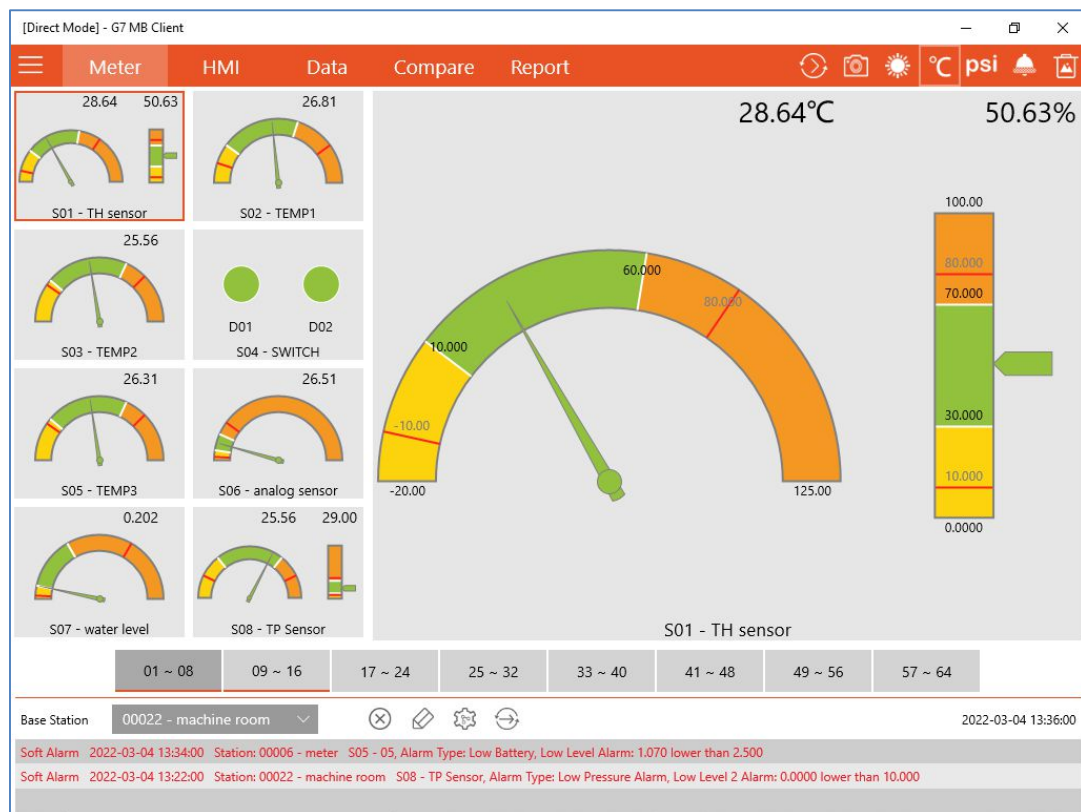

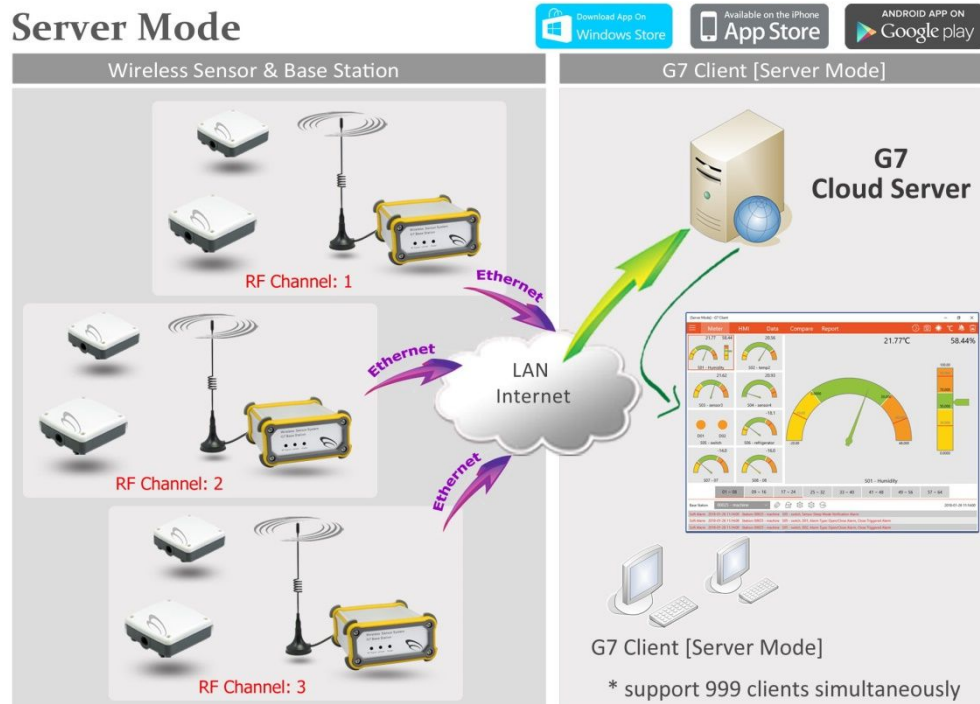
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## 1. Overview

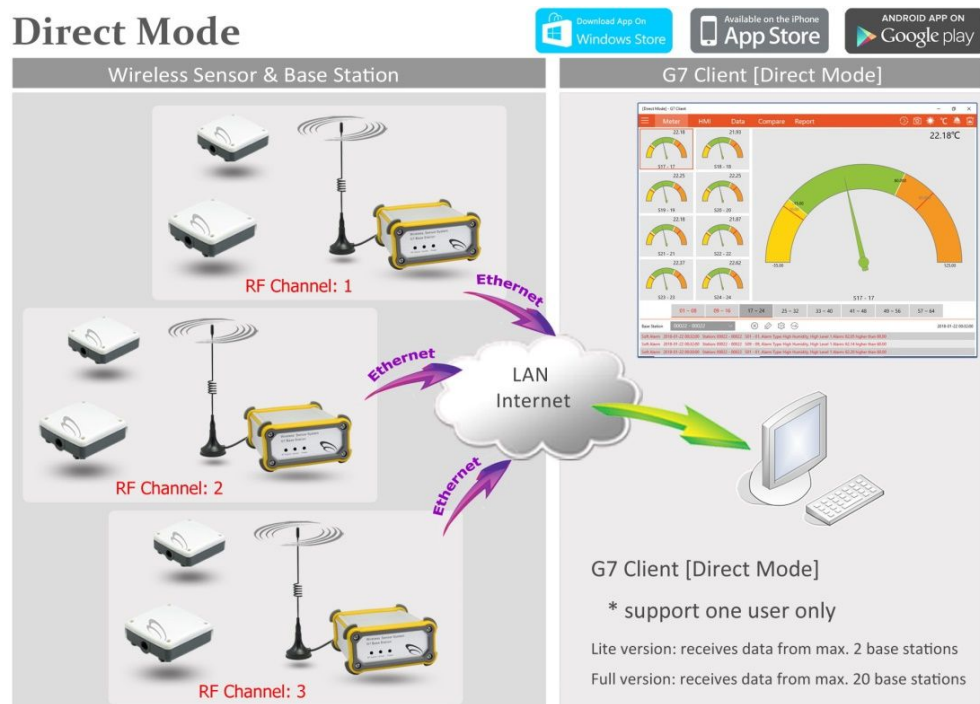
### (1) G7 MB Client - **Server Mode**

- \* Data is transmitted to Base Station from wireless sensor
- \* Base Station uploads data to Server over LAN or Internet
- \* G7 Client app receives data from Server over LAN or Internet



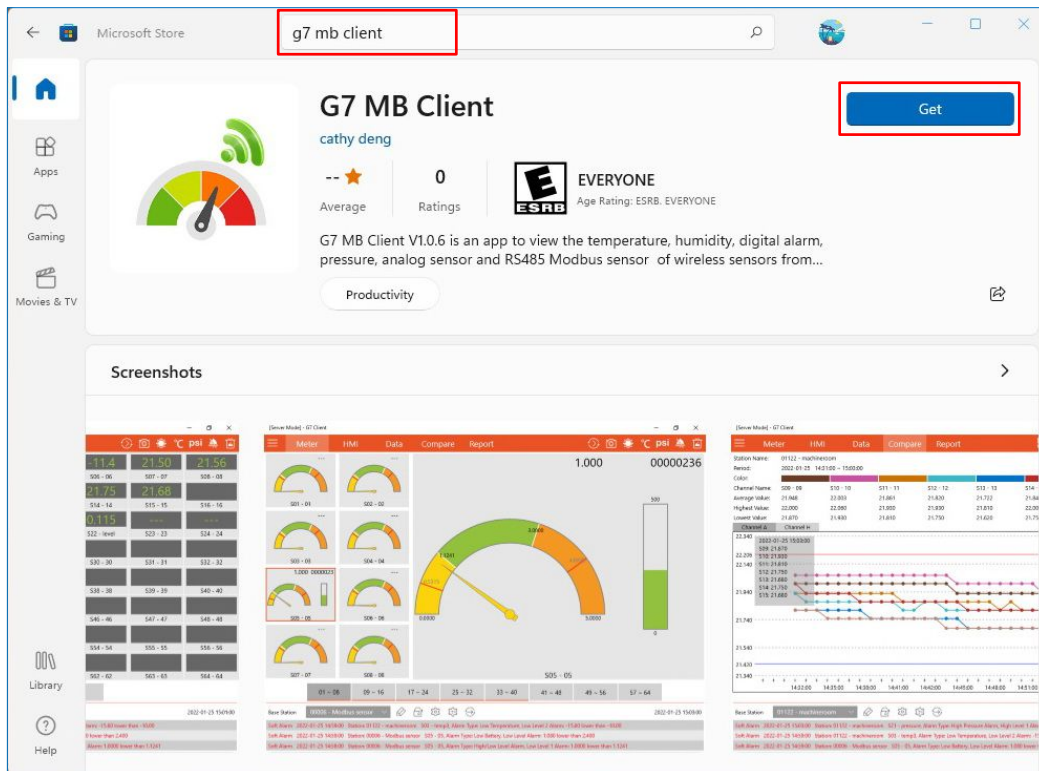
### (2) G7 MB Client - **Direct Mode**

- \* Data is transmitted to Base Station from wireless sensor
- \* Base Station uploads data to G7 Client app over LAN or Internet directly



## 2. Download “G7 MB Client” App from Microsoft Store

Search “G7 MB Client” in keywords, and click [Get] to install



Install “G7 Client for iPad” and “G7 Client for iPhone” from App Store

Install “G7 Client for Android Phone” from Play Store or apk file

- All settings are stored in locally.

(2) Log Off is necessary only when port is changed.

- One single client receives data from max. 2 base stations simultaneously

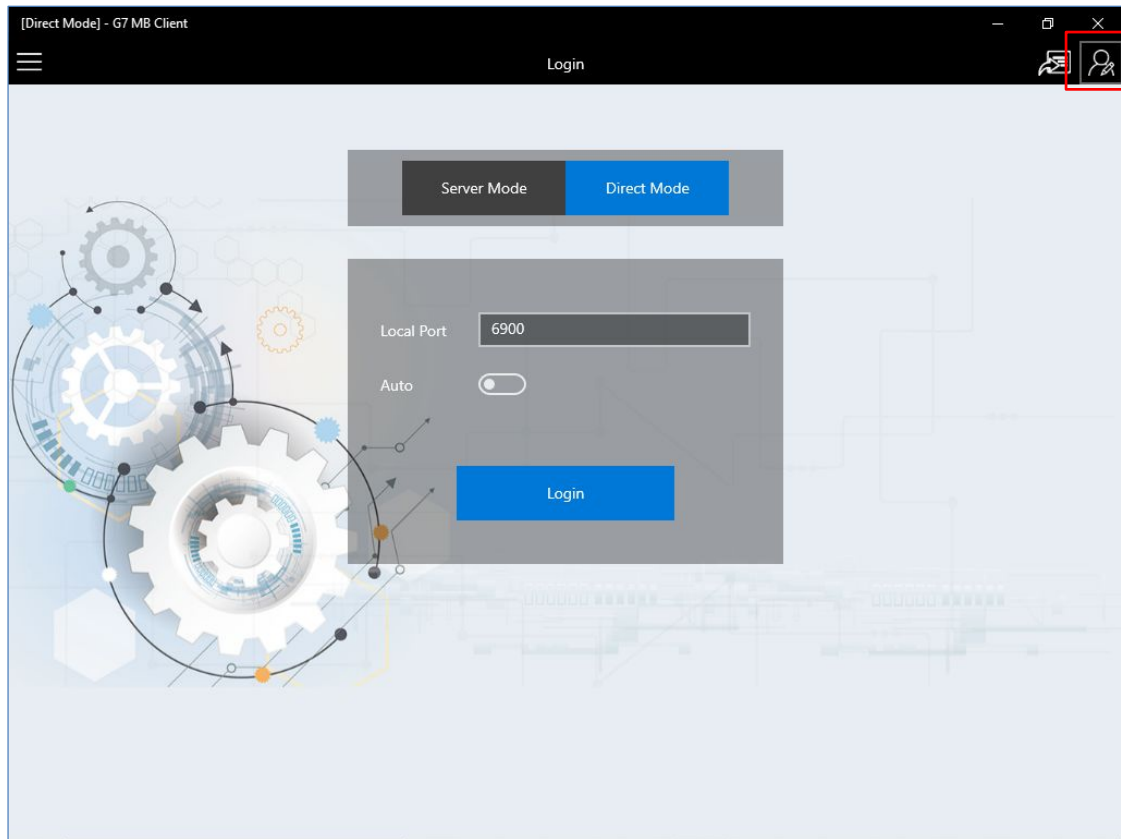

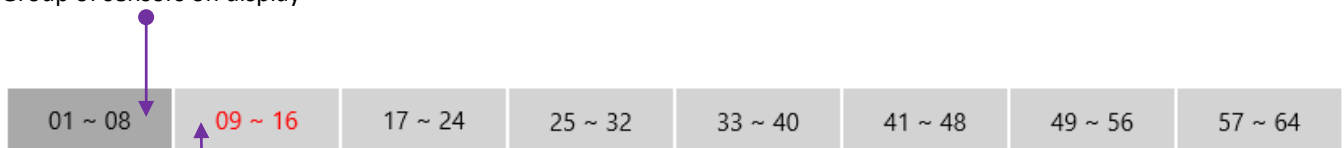

## A) Alarm Setup

- 1) Select Sensor – Left Mouse Click on left side, it will be enlarged and displayed on right side
- 2) Activate Alarm Setup – Double Click Left Mouse Button of selected sensor on right side
- 3) Click on the alarm level line, and drag to change the alarm level
- 4) Beside point and drag the alarm level line, alarm level can be setup by click [  ] button
- 5) Click [  ] to save setting into local computer

### C) Alarm Email Address

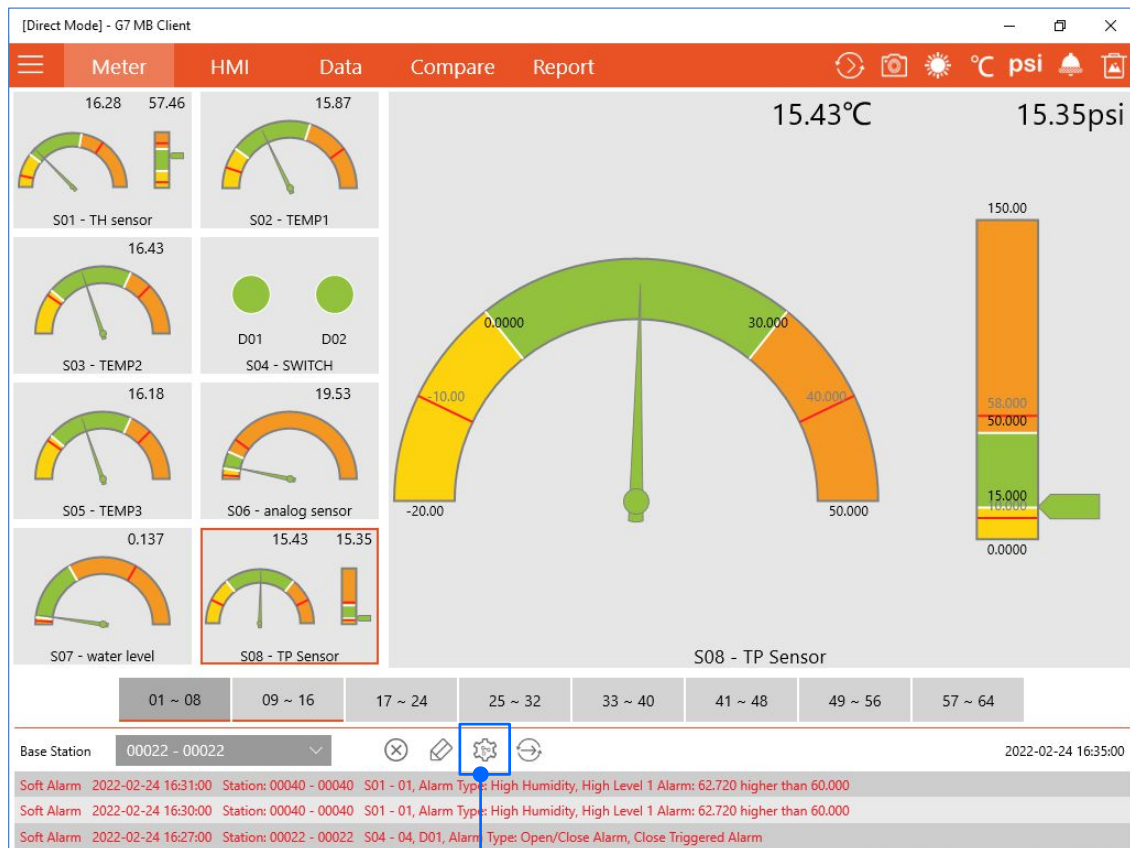

## D) Alert Interval & Alarm Delay

## 8. Sensor Activated / Deactivated

Number of wireless sensors will be automatically detected by G7 MB Client.

Activate/Deactivate individual sensor to avoid false alarm when user adds/disconnects any sensor later.

This setting is done in G7 MB Client [HMI page].

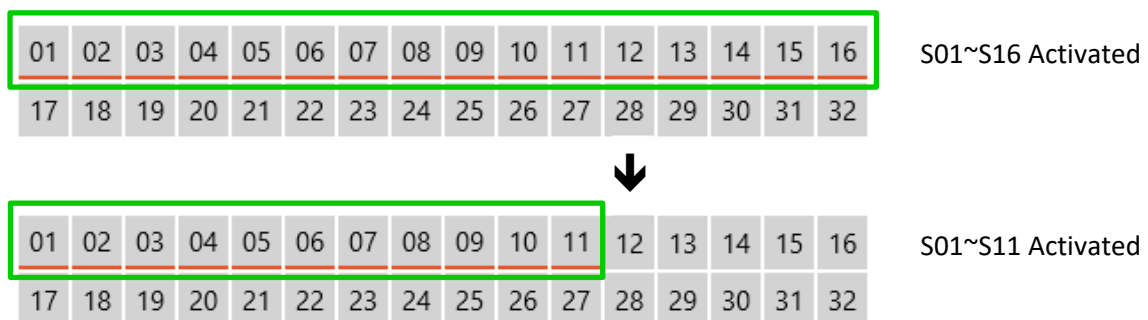


If sensor is not connected but activated, it will cause many false alarms.

In this example, sensors S12~S16 is not connected causing alarms.

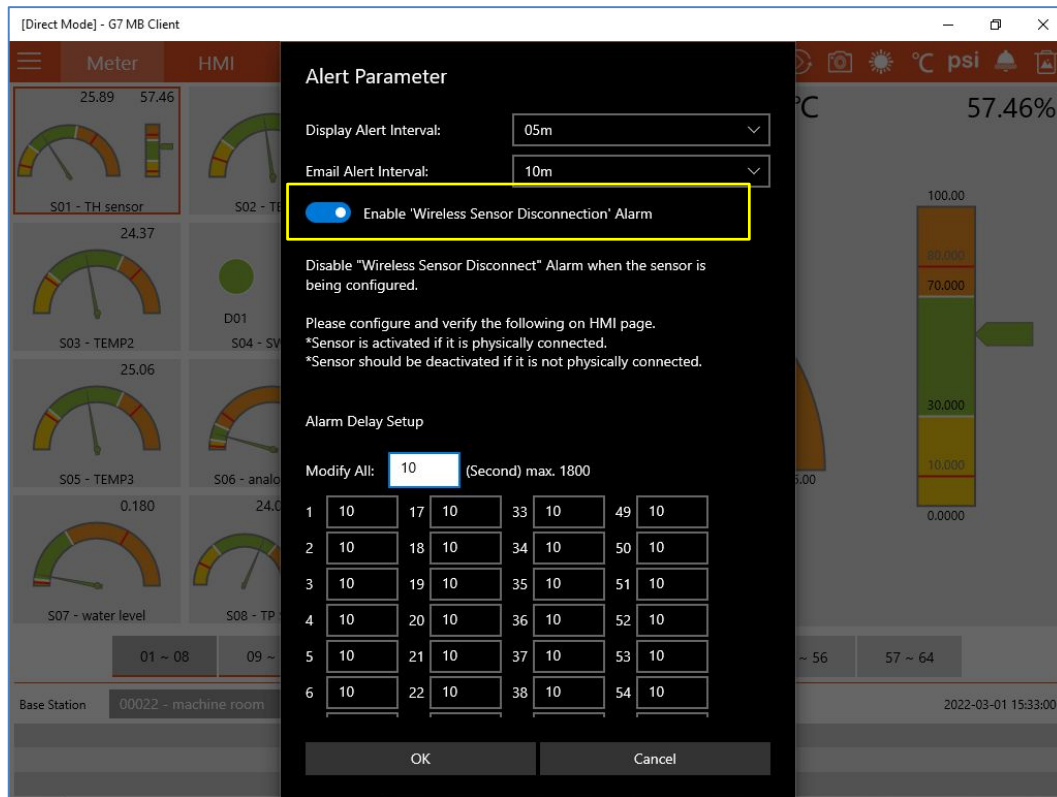
User should deactivate those sensors by Right Mouse Click S12~S16 icons.

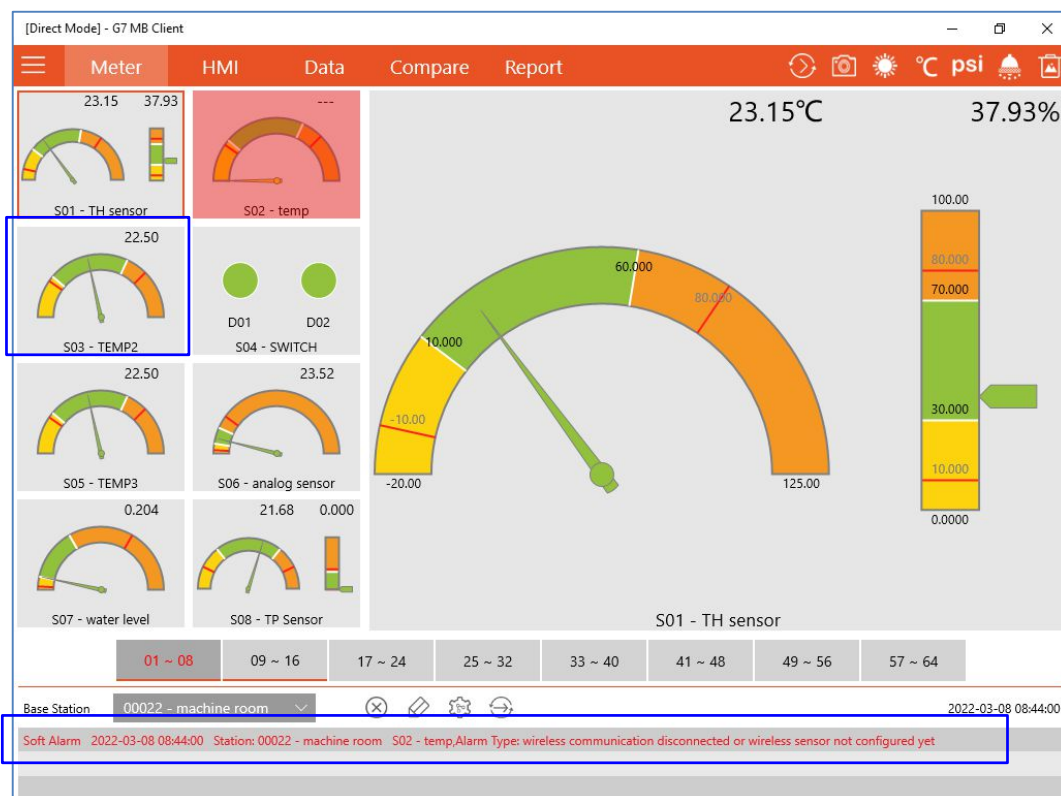
## Sensor Health Status Real Time Monitoring

Enable “Wireless Sensor Disconnection Alarm” will allow Client Software keep checking the communication status of each sensor.



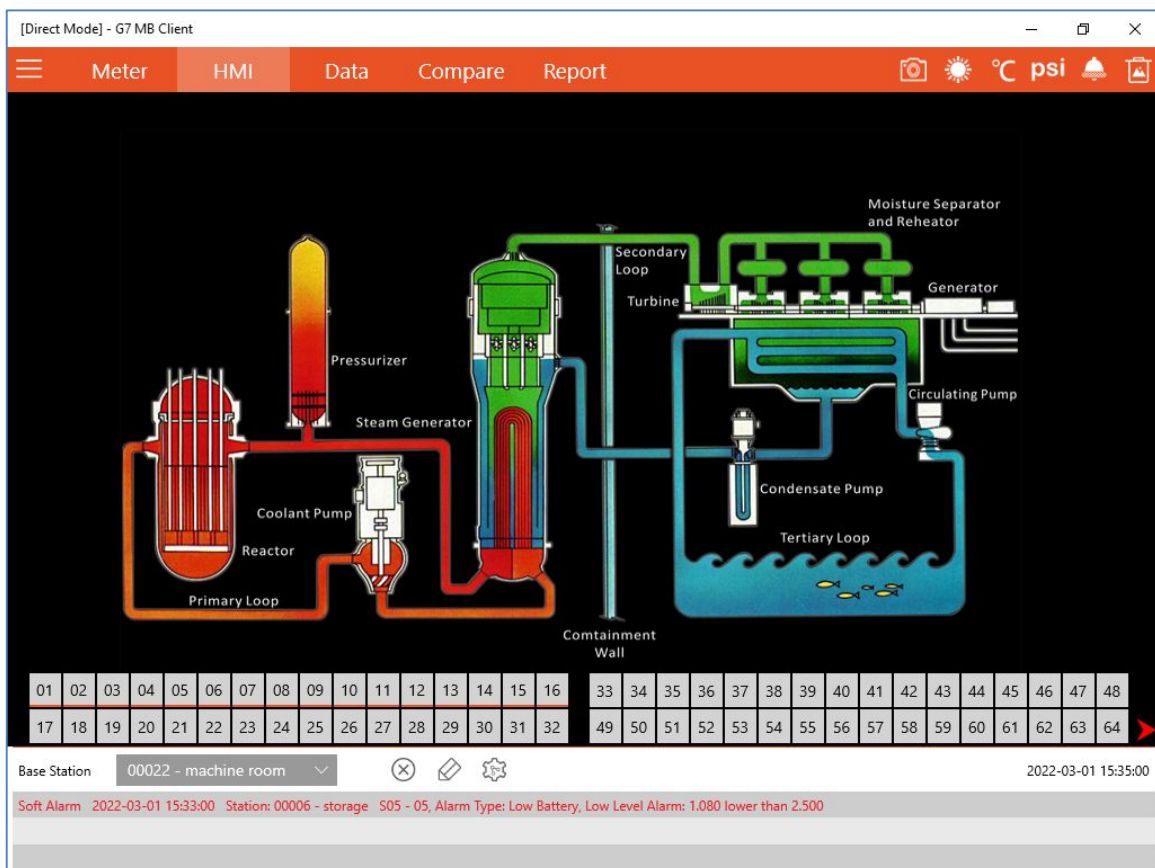
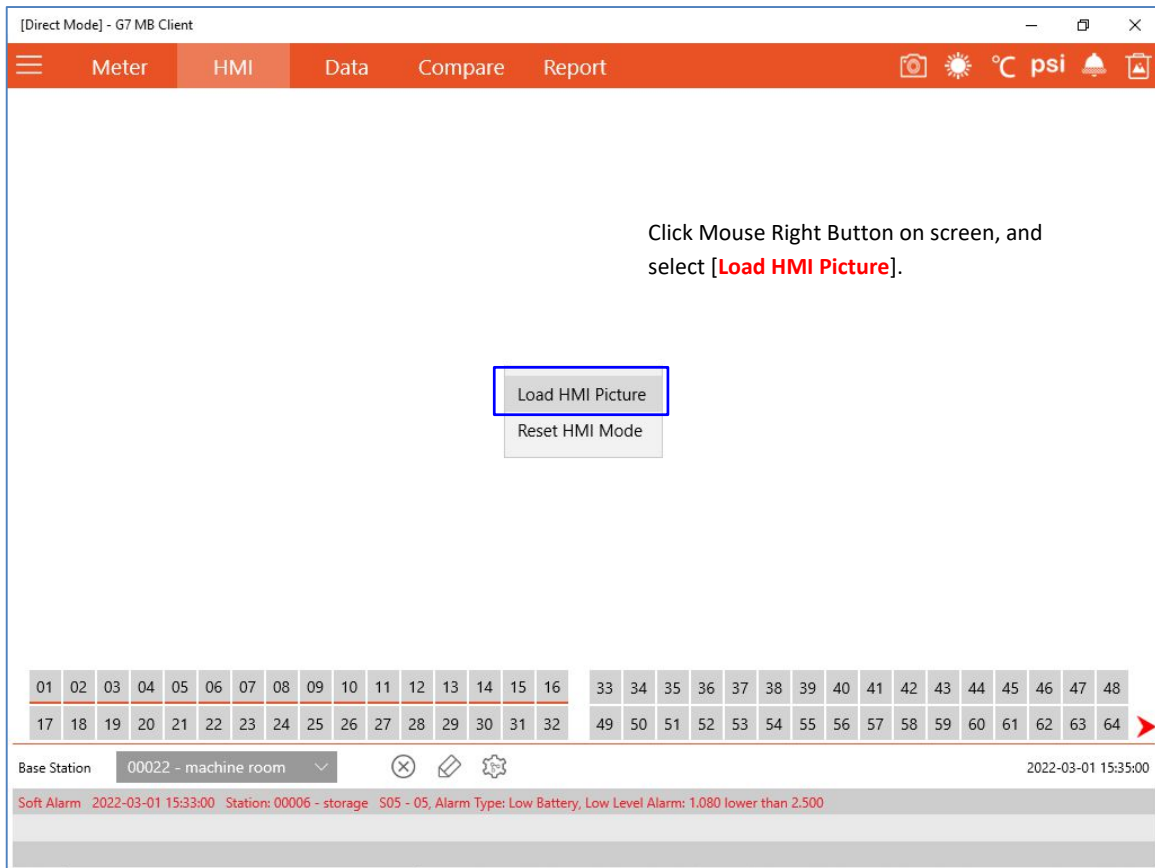

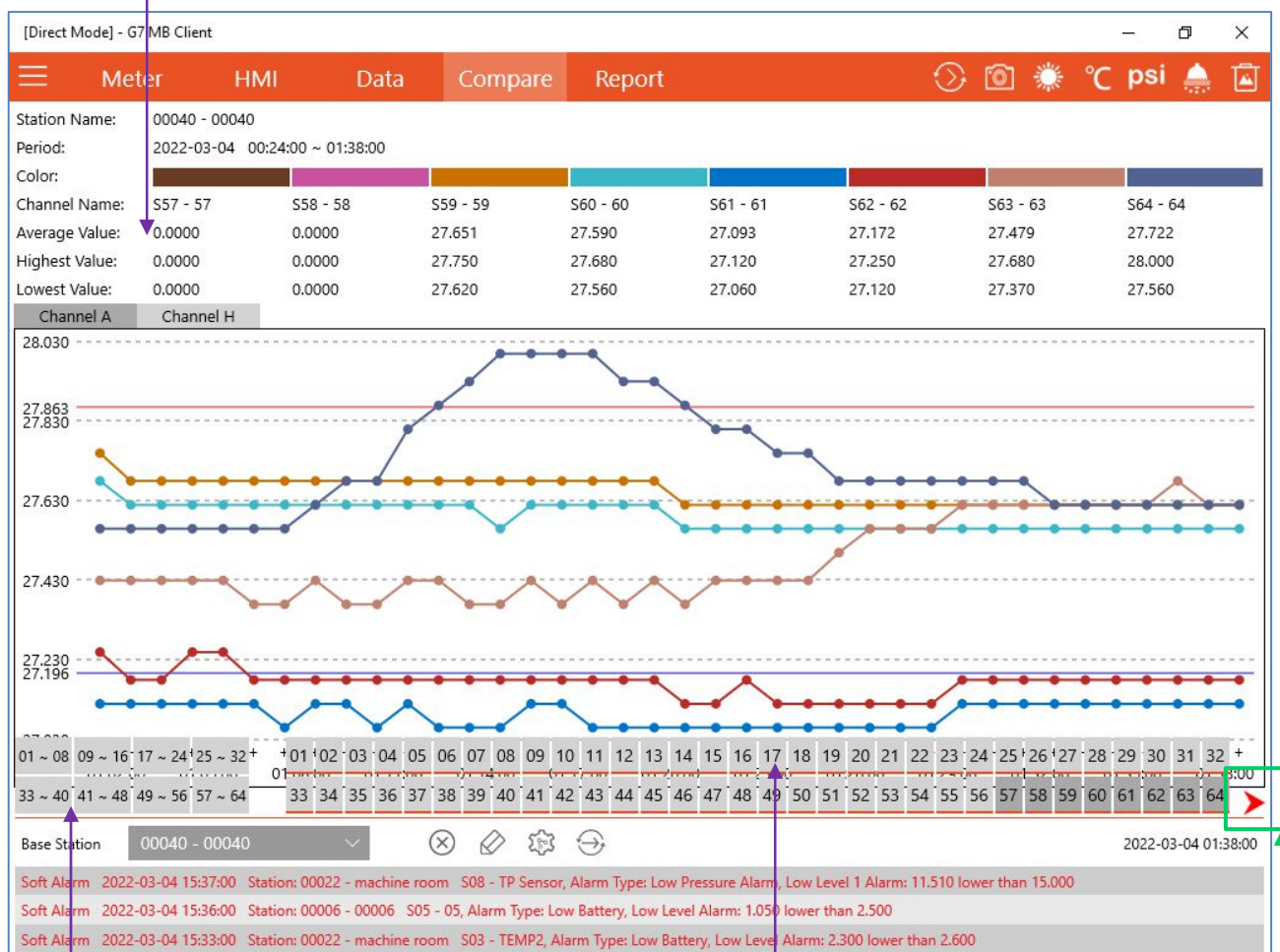
